Rolling deadline	<u>National Lottery Community Fund</u>	Awards for All, Reaching Communities and Partnerships funding programme are now open for applications. Check the website for guidance.
No specific deadline	<u>Percy Bilton Charity</u>	Supports charities working with disadvantaged youth, people with disabilities, people with mental health problems and older people.
Check website	<u>Schroder Charity Trust</u>	Grants support education, communities, environment, health, arts & culture, international development, heritage & the armed forces.
Check website	<u>Sport England - Queen's Platinum Jubilee Activity Fund</u>	Awards to help use sport and physical activity as a means of bringing a community together and tackling inequalities.
No specific deadline	<u>The Archer Trust</u>	Grants of up to £4,000 to VCS organisations who make good use of volunteers. Apply in writing.
Rolling deadline	<u>The Fat Beehive Foundation</u>	Grants for websites and digital products to help those organisations carry out their work in a more efficient and effective way, resulting in positive social benefit.
No specific deadline	<u>The February Foundation</u>	For those in need by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage; for the advancement of education, the arts, culture & heritage. Monthly decisions made.
No specific deadline	<u>The Hargreaves Foundation</u>	Grants for young people under 18 and living with a mental health condition, disability, or growing up in poverty to fulfil their potential whilst improving wellbeing, self-esteem and independence.
See website for next deadline	<u>The Headley Foundation</u>	Trustees meet 4 times a year to support projects across the spectrum of social need. Grants of up to £5k.
Check website	<u>The Screwfix Foundation</u>	Funding to help all sorts of projects, from repairing buildings and improving facilities in deprived areas, to decorating the homes of people living with sickness and disabilities.
Check website	<u>The Wakeham Trust</u>	Small grants for VCS groups to help rebuild their communities.
No specific deadline	<u>Trusthouse Charitable Foundation</u>	Small and major grants for charities based in and carrying out work to improve the lives of people in areas of extreme urban deprivation
None specified	<u>Variety Club - Youth Club Grant</u>	The Fund aims to support youth clubs that provide opportunities for improving social skills, team spirit and self esteem for young people aged from 8 to 18 years.
